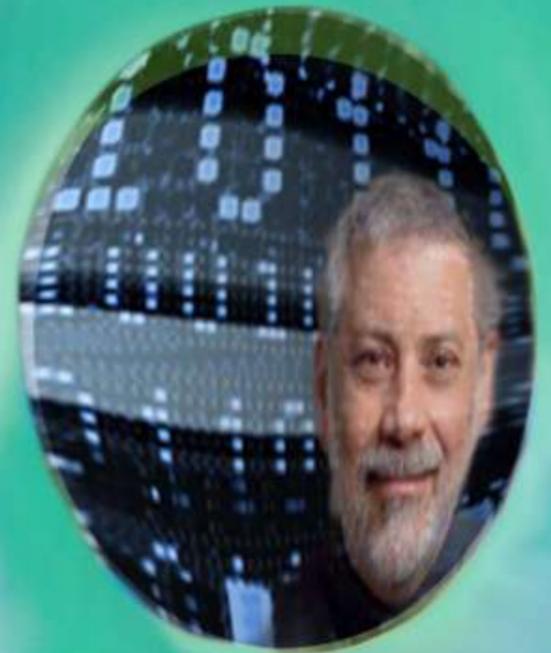
From IBM's Role in the Holocaust to Wikileaks and Social Media

The Speaker

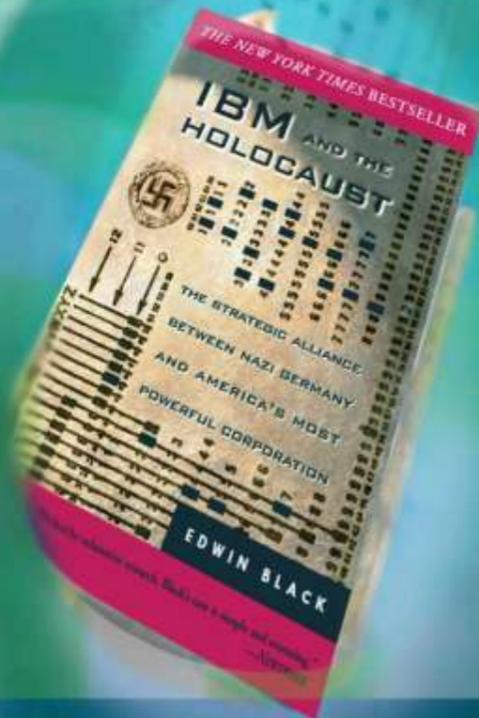
